LYON COUNTY FLOODPLAIN ORDINANCE

ADOPTION OF A STAND ALONE ORDINANCE RELTING TO THE REGULATION OF FLOODPLAIN REGULATIONS; REPEAL OF THE EXISTING FLOODPLAIN ORDINANCE, WHICH IS ARTICLE 6 OF THE LYON COUNTY ZONING ORDINANCE.

SUMMARY OF THE LYON COUNTY FLOODPLAIN ORDINANCE

This ordinance provides the general regulations for development in areas located in the floodplain, address potential conflicts with other County Ordinances, delineates permitted uses, provides provisions for variances, regulates non-conformities and outlines penalties for violations. This ordinance complies with the standards of the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) including the adoption of the effective Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) and Flood Insurance Study (FIS) report. This ordinance repeals Article 6 of the Lyon County Zoning Ordinance. A public hearing to consider the adoption of the ordinance was held by the Lyon County Planning and Zoning Commission on July 12, 2022. The public notice was published in the Tracy Headlight Herald Newspaper on June 29, 2022, and the Department Of Natural Resources was notified on June 16, 2022. The Lyon County Board of Commissioners formally adopted the Ordinance on July 19, 2022. The Lyon County Floodplain Ordinance has been posted to www.lyonco.org.
