As we edge closer to the start of fall, it seems like we'll do so on the dry side — who would've thought that back in June?

No measurable rain has fallen since Aug. 27, and it appears we won't see any in the near future, as sunny skies are predicted for about the next week.

Highs will climb into the upper 80s today (Sept. 11), and 80s will carry us into another warm weekend and into Monday. After Monday, however, it seems as if we're done with the mercury climbing into that range for the year.

Crop report ...

Minnesota farmers averaged 6.2 days suitable for fieldwork the week ending Sept. 8, according to the US-DA's National Agricultural Statistics Service.

Fieldwork included chopping corn or silage and harvest of small grains, sugarbeets, and potatoes. Livestock were doing well with no issues reported.

Topsoil moisture supplies were rated 2 percent very short, 14 percent short, 74 percent adequate, and 10 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were rated 2 percent very short, 9 percent short, 79 percent adequate, and 10 percent surplus.
